

SSCC GRASS AUTOCROSS SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

12 December 2021

1. JURISDICTION

These events are ClubSport Basic Status Events, promoted by the Southland Sports Car Club at Teretonga Park, Invercargill. It will be run in accordance with the Motorsport New Zealand National Sporting Code, Appendix Five Schedule C and Appendix Two Sch A in the current MotorSport New Zealand Manual, and these Supplementary Regulations.

3. ENTRIES

- Entries should be made through the MotorSport New Zealand Online system (<https://possum.motorsport.org.nz>).
- Entries will not be deemed valid until payment is received.
- Alternatively, entries may be submitted manually in 'hard copy' form which are available at www.teretonga.org.nz/clubsport. All such entries must be made on the correct form, must be complete in all detail, and accompanied by the appropriate fees
- Entries can also be emailed to info@teretonga.org.nz or dropped in to the Teretonga Park Office, 86 Sandy Point Road, Otatara during office hours (Monday – Friday 9.00am to 5.00pm)
- Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with the prescribed provisions of the National Sporting Code.

3.1 Closing Dates: The Entry Closing date will be at 12pm on the Thursday prior to the event.
Entries may be accepted on the day at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

3.2 Entry Fees: The entry fee is \$60.

4. FORCE MAJEURE

- If due to Force Majeure, the required number of runs cannot be completed, the Clerk of the Course has the authority to reduce the number of runs counting toward the result.

5. CLASSES

- The event will be divided into the following classes:
 - (A) Over 1600cc
 - (B) Under 1600cc

6. NUMBER OF STARTERS

- The maximum number of starters will be 80. Any additional entries received will be placed on the reserve list in order of receipt.

7. COMPETITOR REQUIREMENTS

- All Drivers must attend the Drivers Briefing.
- Drivers should have as a minimum a current New Zealand Drivers Licence.
- Alcohol is not permitted to be consumed by any competitor or their crew at the event before or during the day's competition.

- Any driver between the ages of 12-16 years of age, who does not hold a valid MotorSport NZ competition licence, may be allowed to compete on the following conditions –
 - That the venue restrictions along with the vehicle type and cubic capacity restrictions detailed in Appendix One Schedule L Article 3.2(2) are respected; and
 - An underage indemnity form has been completed correctly by Parent/Guardian; and
 - Only at the discretion of the event Clerk of the Course.
- Drivers intending to take passengers must complete a Driver Indemnity form at documentation.

8. CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS AS PER SCHEDULE A

- An approved crash helmet.
- Clean, protective one piece fire-retardant or 100% cotton fabric overalls and leather footwear that completely cover the feet must be worn.
- Underwear must be either cotton or wool.

9. PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

- Passengers may be carried at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course provided that Article 6 of Appendix 5 Schedule C in the current MotorSport New Zealand manual is adhered to.
- The minimum age of passengers is 12 and they must have completed an Underage Indemnity Form.
- Passenger Indemnity Form must be completed prior to entering the vehicle.

10. VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS

- Vehicles shall either –
 - a. be to a warrantable standard; or
 - b. have a Motorsport New Zealand Vehicle Log Book.
- Electric vehicles may be accepted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course providing they have the appropriate certification/logbook from MotorSport NZ.
- Noise limit 95dba.

11. FUEL HANDLING AND STORAGE

- Fuel storage and handling shall be the competitor's responsibility. Competitors are reminded that they are required to be familiar with the MotorSport New Zealand Code of Practice for Motorsport Fuel – Storage and Handling.

12. MEMBERSHIP

- All drivers must hold a current club membership of a MSNZ affiliated Member Club except for new competitors to motorsport, who may compete in two (2) Basic Status Events before being required to join a club. To be eligible for the SSCC Autocross Championship, competitors must be a member of the Southland Sports Car Club.
